FROM THE RECTOR, MR BOVEY



Dear Parents/Guardians,

Re: **PNBHS Supporters Code of Conduct**

With the busy winter sports season kicking off it is timely to remind our community of our 'Supporters Code of Conduct'. At school we discuss our expectations of our teams and our young men and it is important that these are supported at home and on the sidelines. Thus, a Supporters Code of Conduct has been introduced which outlines the expected behaviour of those choosing to support PNBHS teams:

- 1 Always remember the boys are involved in sport for their enjoyment, not yours.
- 2 Set an example – applaud good play and good effort.
- 3 Do not criticise team members or opponents for making a mistake.
- 4 Criticism of referees or umpires is unacceptable – officials give freely of their time and effort and do not deserve to be harassed by people on the side-line.
- 5 Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- 6 Do not come on to the field of play; do not enter changing rooms. No parents in halftime huddles.
- 7 Recognise the value of coaches and managers who give their time to provide opportunities for our young men.

At the heart of the matter is that we want our young men playing because they enjoy playing. They do not want to be embarrassed by the conduct of family members or supporters on the side of the field. Not everyone will be a national representative; it is important to keep that in mind to provide a realistic context.

It is important to remember also that not all staff members and other volunteers will be the next national coach and yet some on the sideline think it their right to criticise team selection and offer uninvited advice; not every referee or umpire will be a professional. We want to encourage all those involved to stay involved, something that is more important than ever after the prolonged period of lockdown in recent months.

Thank you for your support with this and I look forward to seeing many of you on the sidelines in the coming months.

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FROM THE SENIOR MASTER, MR SINCLAIR



Kia ora koutou,

This week has definitely been one of “getting back to normal”, with our first full assemblies taking place and sport and cultural activities preparing to start. There has been a real “buzz” in the air around school and the busyness of full school life has returned with a vengeance.

For senior students, many are completing internal assessments and the results of these will be entered into our school system and available for parents to view through the Parent Portal. An addition to the reporting process this year, is that alongside each grade, there will be a brief teacher comment explaining the result. We hope that this assists in providing more timely feedback for our young men and parents/caregivers.

For the junior school, there will not be the normal examination week in terms of having a week’s study leave and formal two-hour school examinations. However, it is important for our young men to appreciate that Palmerston North Boys’ High School highly values the formal testing / examination process, and the assessments taking place in week nine of this term should not be taken lightly. While the process will be less formal in some respects, with the assessments taking place during normal class periods, it is important that students prepare thoroughly for these and aim to do the best that they can. Further, it is critical that students get reliable, formal feedback on how well they understand the concepts and content that they have studied to date, and how well they can apply the important skills required in their subjects. Preparing thoroughly for the assessments in their subjects will assist in this process.

Information relating to the main content and skills being assessed in the four core subjects has recently been provided, but your son needs to be proactive over the coming week, **and ask for guidance from his teachers** if he is in doubt as to what will be required during assessment week.

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

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

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NCEA and University Entrance (UE) 2020 COVID-19 Response

Why has NZQA done this?

- NZQA knows that it was hard for students during the lockdown and that some assessments couldn't happen. These changes are to help you gain the qualification you were aiming to achieve this year.

What does it mean for me?

The more credits you achieve the more you are entitled to

- For every 5 credits you achieve through internal or external assessment, you are entitled to 1 more credit. These extra credits are called Learning Recognition Credits (LR Credits)
 - >> Up to 10 of your LR credits can count towards the 80 you need for NCEA Level 1
 - >> Up to 8 LR credits can count towards the 60 you need at Level 2 and Level 3

Endorsements are still achievable

- To get a **certificate endorsement** this year you need 46 credits at Merit or Excellence level, instead of the usual 50. Your LR credits don't come with Merit or Excellence so they can't count towards an endorsement.
- To get a **course endorsement** this year you need 12 credits at Merit or Excellence level in a course rather than 14. You still need to achieve at least 3 credits in externals and 3 in internals.

University Entrance has been adjusted

- For 2020 the UE requirements have been adjusted from 14 down to 12 credits in three UE-approved subjects. You still need to have NCEA Level 3 and the usual literacy and numeracy standards.

You've got more time to study

- Portfolio due dates and exams for NCEA and Scholarship have been moved later to give you more time to learn and prepare.


What do I need to do?

- Keep working to make sure that you achieve as many standards as you can. The more you achieve, the more LR Credits you are entitled to.
- Your teachers will help you to track your progress. NZQA will do the calculations and count your LR credits towards your NCEA certificate. You don't need to do anything else.
- Make sure that you know when your portfolios are due and double check the new exam timetable.
- If you need any more information talk to your teacher, your Dean or the person in your school who manages NCEA (Principal's Nominee), or you can ring NZQA on 0800 697 296.

What else do I need to know?

- You must be enrolled in an NCEA course at a secondary school in 2020 to be entitled to LR credits.
- The LR credits won't show on your Record of Achievement (ROA), but you will be able to see how many you got through your Learner Login when you check your results next January.
- If you don't complete your qualification this year, your LR credits will count towards that qualification again in 2021.

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HOW ARE YOU FEELING?

FURTHER TESTING INFORMATION

- COVID-19 testing is available seven days per week across the district.
- You need to get a test for COVID-19 if you have any one of the following symptoms: cough, runny nose, sore throat, sneezing, shortness of breath, loss of smell or taste, fever of 38°C or above.
- We have six testing centres – two in Palmerston North, and one each in Manawatū, Tararua, Horowhenua and Ōtaki. We also have a mobile testing unit, which is available to visit people who can't get to a centre.
- The testing sites are operated by trained clinicians who will ensure your test is handled in a quick and professional manner while complying with all required safety protocols
- A marae-based testing centre is set up at Whakapai Hauora in Palmerston North.
- COVID-19 tests are free.
