A) Curriculum and Academic Achievement

Achievement at all Levels

The young men of PNBHS must focus on their academic achievement. The school will aim to;

- develop diversity in academic courses, particularly at senior level
- review and develop junior courses and curriculum
- maintain a continual focus on raising academic achievement
- develop and support strategies to further raise achievement at all levels of priority learners/students identified as at risk
- monitor, implement and support strategies to further raise Maori and Pasifika student achievement
- maintain the academic rigour of the accelerate programme
- develop the use of e-learning as a component of effective teaching
- monitor achievement to identify students with achievement challenges at each NCEA level

- improve the percentage of NCEA Merit and Excellence endorsements
- continue to support strategies to improve student literacy
- leavers' NCEA Level 2 achievement rate to be at 95% or better
- develop clear academic pathways and transition from junior to senior school and for those leaving school
- provide a teaching and learning environment at PNBHS that maximises student achievement.

(B) Co-curricular

Involvement For All/Strong Competition

PNBHS recognises the importance of co-curricular activities in an all-round education and aims to;

- provide opportunities through every staff member being involved in the school's co-curricular programme
- encourage every young man at PNBHS to be involved in co-curricular activities
- development resources for support of co-curricular activities
- develop parental and Old Boys' support
- review and develop co-curricular programmes within the school
- develop coaching/tutoring abilities amongst staff
- recognition for "middle-order batsmen"
- be consistently competitive at local, regional and national level.

(C) Staff

Quality Staff in Every Classroom

PNBHS recognises that the single most influential aspect of effective teaching and learning is an excellent teacher. The school will aim to;

- continue to develop an appraisal system that encourages self-review and teacher professional learning and development
- attract and develop of high quality staff
- provide appropriate PLD opportunities for staff through both internal and external PLD
- provide recognition and reward staff who go "above and beyond"
- provide opportunities for teachers to discuss progress/teaching with HOD /PLG leader
- emphasise the value of relational teaching and maintain a focus on effective teaching practices.

- ensure the values and standards of PNBHS clearly defined
- clearly articulate expectations to both staff and students to ensure the reputation of the school is enhanced

- ensure the school vision and values are articulated and displayed.
